In Ireland, 73% of LGBTQ+ young people reported that they do not feel safe at school. However, research shows that effective school-based interventions can improve the lives and experiences of LGBTQ+ students.

In 2022, Belong To will partner with 35 post-primary schools nationwide to support them in working towards achieving the Belong To LGBTQ+ Quality Mark.

They should stay at home until those symptoms have finished.
