THE NAUGHTON SCHOLARSHIPS TERMS AND CONDITIONS 2023

- **What are the Naughton Scholarships?**

The Naughton Scholarships are a scheme of scholarships to promote the study of engineering, science and technology at third level by students in Ireland. For 2023, the scheme applies to all counties in the Republic of Ireland (the “Applicable Counties”).

Thirty Six Scholarships will be awarded in 2023 – one to a student from each of the Applicable Counties with the exception of Cork and Galway where there will be two scholarships and Dublin where there will be four. There will also be four additional scholarships awarded by choice of the Trustees. Each Scholarship award will be €5,000 for each year of that student’s third-level course (up to a maximum of four years).

- Must be sitting the Leaving Certificate in 2023
