Starting First Year in St. Peter's College

Starting out in a new school can be a daunting experience but you need to remember that everyone will have the same worries and concerns. By chatting with other sixth class students, you will realise that many of you will have the same worries and concerns. You may find the answers to your questions in the question and answer section of this booklet or your teacher may be able to help you. For anything else, please ask your teacher to contact our school with a list of your questions and we will get back to you with the answers.



Questions

As you start in your new school, you are bound to have many questions. The following information may help to answer some of those questions.

What is my tutor class?

Every student is assigned to a tutor class. Your tutor will teach you for one of your subjects and he/she will be the person who helps you with day to day issues. Your parents should also contact your tutor with their concerns. Your tutor will help you to get used to your new school.

What is a timetable?

A timetable is a list of all the classes you have on each day of the week. It will name your class, your teacher and tell you where to find your classroom. Most classes last for 40 minutes but option classes, Science and PE last for 80 minutes. Keep a copy of your timetable in your diary and at home. Help with reading your timetable can be found later in this booklet.

What is assembly?

Each year group has assembly with their tutors and Ceannaire (Year head). At assembly, important notices for students are discussed and explained. It is also where we celebrate student successes and achievements.

Who are the Monitors?

Monitors are Transition Year students assigned to every first year tutor class. Their role is to help you with any questions or concerns that you may have in your first year.

Tell me about the lockers

Lockers are issued to every student at the start of the school year. You will be given a padlock that you must keep on the locker. This will keep your belongings safe. We advise students get mesh book bags to keep everything needed for a subject together. This will make it easier and quicker for you when you are at your locker. If you have any locker problem, please let Ms Acton know and we will help you.

What is the School Journal?

The journal is a school document.

It contains important school information, policies, permission

slips, absence notes and your

homework journal. Students

must bring it to every class.

What sports can I play?

Sports at St. Peter's include: football, hurling, camogie, basketball, athletics, equestrian and table tennis. Training takes place after school. Listen for announcements at assembly and during the morning announcements regarding training and when to sign up for teams. No experience is necessary, so do sign up for a sport. It is a great way to meet new friends.

I'm not into sport, what can I do?

There are a variety of nonsporting activities such as debating, the games room, Chess club, Lego Club, Choir, Orchestra, the Traditional Music Group and the Green Schools Committee. The Library holds many exciting activities for students such as Open Mic competitions, Creative Writing and Book Club. Great friendships have developed out of these clubs.

How do I manage my homework?

Getting used to being assigned homework by a number of teachers in one day sounds like it could be tricky but the important thing is to remember to write down all homework in your homework journal. Remember to write down learning homework as well as written homework. You should also note when the homework is due as you will be able to spread the work over the week. Homework for first year students should take no longer than 1.5 to 2 hours. If it is taking you longer than this, please tell you tutor or ask a parent or guardian to contact your tutor.

I have personal worries and I would like to talk to someone

Sometimes students have personal worries or problems that they would like to discuss in private. If you have a concern, please let your Ceannairí, Mr McCarthy or Ms O Carroll, know and they will link you in with the correct supports – the Special Educational Needs Team, Guidance Counsellors or the school Chaplain.

What does the uniform look like and where do I get it?

The junior uniform is a St. Peter's College, green, round neck jumper, kilt or navy trousers for girls, navy trousers for boys and a white shirt. All students are required to wear the St. Peter's College school uniform coat. No other coat is permitted. Black shoes should be worn.

All students wear the school PE uniform for PE and all school sports events. The St. Peter's College polo shirt and hoodie can be purchased from Dunboyne Sports & Leisure, Main St, Dunboyne and should be worn with plain tracksuit bottoms or active/sportswear leggings.



When will I start in St. Peter's College?

You will start in school on August 28th, 2023.

What happens on the first day of school?

On your first day at school, you will be assigned into your tutor group, meet your tutor and the Monitors for your class. Your tutor and Monitors will give you a tour of the school and they will explain important things that you need to know in our school such as how to read your timetable. The Monitors will continue to help you in the months ahead. Everyone will be delighted to help you to settle into our school.

What will I need on the first day?

On the first day you will not have any formal classes so there is no need to bring books. You should bring your pencil case and a copy for writing down notes. You should also bring a healthy, packed lunch and water or juice to drink.

Getting used to working with a timetable

In primary school you are used to working with one teacher, all day long. In secondary school students have different teachers for every subject. Most classes last for 40 minutes but some practical subjects last for 80 minutes. This means that you will have frequent changes of teacher. You will also move classroom for each subject.

Below you will see a sample timetable for a first year student.

At first glance it may appear a little complicated but once you understand it, it is quite easy to read.

The first line of the timetable shows all classes on Monday. Each block in the line represents a class. The blocks contain information about the class; the subject, the teacher and the room. Some subjects have two teachers, this is so that we can provide extra help to students in class. Optional subjects are shown with a code: 1 OPT 1, 1 OPT 2 and 1 OPT 3.

In this example, the first class on Monday is Geography. The letters and numbers underneath are the code for the teacher and the room number. This Geography class will take place in room 25 with Mr O Reilly. The second class of the day is History. It is in room 36 with Ms Woolhead. Now it is your turn to have a try at reading the timetable!

- 1. What are this student's options?
- 2. On what days does this student have Maths classes?
- 3. What subjects have double classes?
- 4. What room does this student go to for Art?
- 5. What time is little break and lunch?
- 6. On what days does school finish early?
