What does the new scale hope to achieve?

- ▶ To minimise random selection on some courses – less chance of many students on same points with the removal of multiples of 5 e.g. Higher C2 was worth 65 points, now a H4 is worth 66 points.
- ▶ To encourage more students to take up higher level subjects by awarding points at H7 grade

Bonus Points for Higher Maths

- ▶ 25 Bonus Points for Higher Level Mathematics continue to be awarded to students achieving H6 and above i.e. 40% or above.
- ▶ Therefore, the CAO will award as follows:

H6 40%-49%	71 points
H7 30%-39%	37 points

- ▶ Be au fait with all aspects of the application system used (CAO) for these courses, i.e., procedures, dates, fees, rules, etc.

What is Biological and Biomedical Sciences?

Biology is the study of living things; we explore how life first arose: the properties that distinguish living organisms from inert matter; how the vast diversity of life forms was generated; how organisms reproduce themselves; how they interact both with each other and with the environment. Biology is fundamental to understanding the world we live in and plays a huge role in medicine.

Modern biological science is unravelling the mysteries of life; it is helping us to meet the challenge of illnesses such as dementia and cancer, to defend against new viruses and drug-resistant bacteria, and to protect ecosystems from climate change and other threats.

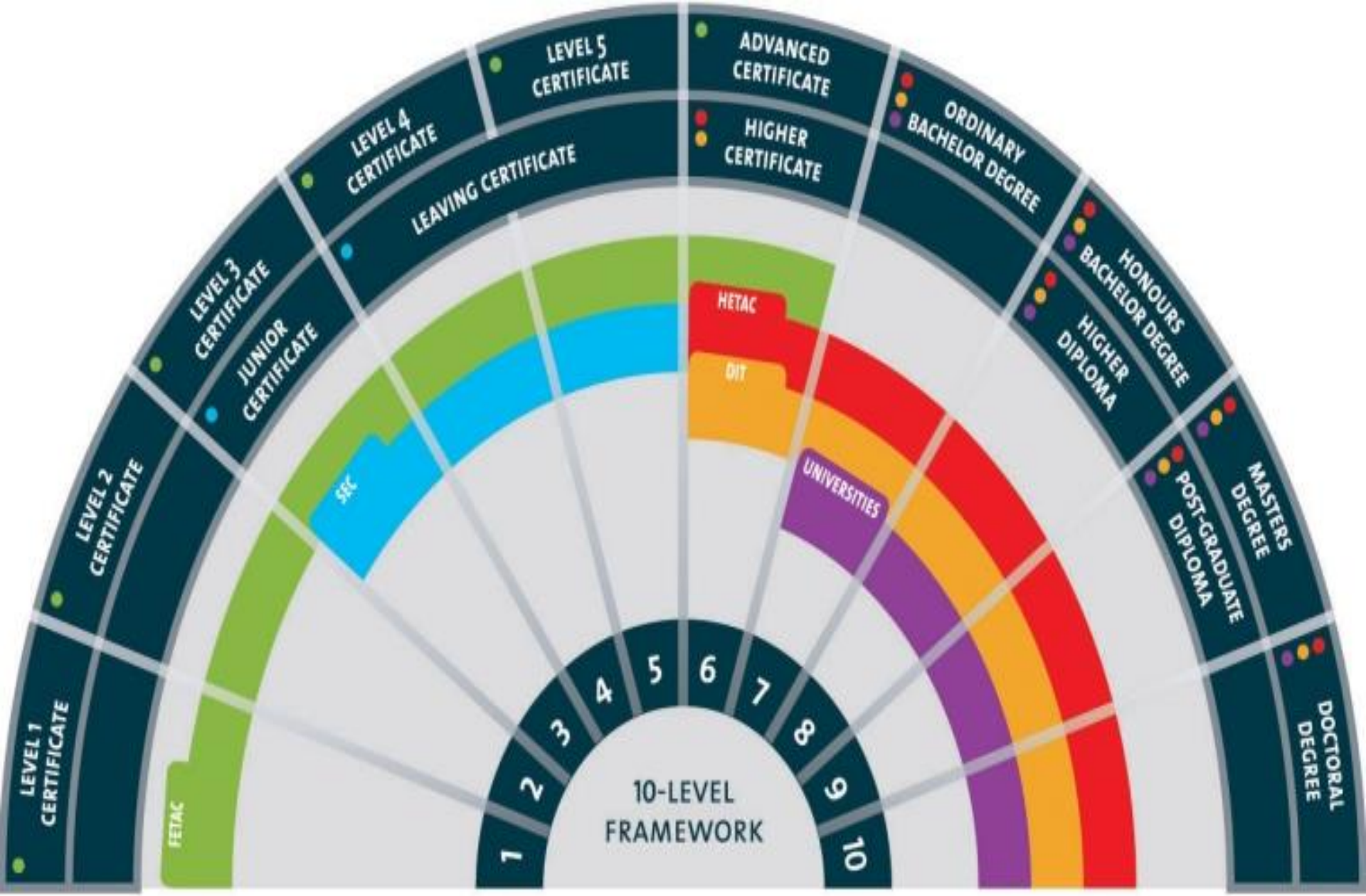

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

These must be satisfied before “points” are considered.

If all Entry Requirements are met → applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.

POINTS SYSTEM

Generally in the CAO system

No. of qualified applicants > No. of course places

--> selection system is needed.

Selection system used in Irish 3rd Level Colleges is based on:

- ▶ Points calculated from **ONE** sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- ▶ Points total is calculated from **SIX** best subjects
- ▶ Entry Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate

Genuine Order of Preference

- ▶ They should not put down courses on the basis of their predictions of next year's cut off points or their own points scores.

- ▶ The position of a course in a student's preference order does not in any way affect their chance of getting a place on that course.
- ▶ The exact same procedure takes place for both lists on the form, hence students may receive 2 offers in August – one from each list, may accept only one.
- ▶ Students should think carefully about not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.
- ▶ Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in round 1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in subsequent rounds if they become entitled one.

Not checking details on students' statement of record e.g. date of birth

Failing to respond to communication from the CAO – records of all communication are logged on applicant's account

After Making Application

- ▶ Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices – check this carefully.
- ▶ Some students may be called for extra assessments.
- ▶ Receive Statement of Application Record – check details carefully.
- ▶ Change of Mind facility becomes available – use sparingly and carefully.
- ▶ Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO.
- ▶ Places are allocated online.
- ▶ Students accept, reject or defer offered places.
- ▶ Further rounds of offers are made until all course places are filled.

Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)

HEAR is a third level alternative admissions scheme which offers places on reduced points and extra college support to school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds who are resident in the Republic of Ireland.

You should apply to both HEAR and DARE if they are relevant to you. Applicants who apply and are deemed eligible for both DARE and HEAR will be prioritised by the participating colleges and universities when offering their reduced points places.

What is DARE?

DARE is a third level alternative admissions scheme for school-leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their second level education.

DARE offers reduced points places to school leavers who as a result of having a disability have experienced additional educational challenges in second level education.

What types of disabilities does DARE consider?

- Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) / Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Autistic Spectrum Disorder (including Asperger's Syndrome)
- Blind / Vision Impaired
- Deaf / Hard of Hearing
- Developmental Co-ordination Disorder (DCD) – Dyspraxia / Dysgraphia
- Mental Health Condition
- Neurological Condition (including Brain Injury and Epilepsy)
- Speech and Language Communication Disorder
- Significant On-going Illness
- Physical Disability
- Specific Learning Difficulty (including Dyslexia & Dyscalculia)



U.C.A.S. (UK Colleges)

- ▶ Over 333 Universities
- ▶ Students select up to 5 courses in alphabetical order.
- ▶ Closing Date for standard courses 31st of January.
- ▶ Personal Statement and Reference require
- ▶ Operate a clearing system so late places may be available.
- ▶ UCAS application require a significant amount of preparation by the student. Applicants should have completed the application before the Christmas holidays

- ▶ Strongly advise our students to apply for a PLC course – backdoor into a course / foundation year before entering 3rd level college
- ▶ Dunboyne College of Further Education over 60 courses at both Level 5 & Level 6 (www.dunboynecollege.ie)
- ▶ 2 main types of PLC courses:
 - a) Pre-university courses with links to 3rd level colleges
 - b) Vocational courses e.g. pharmacy assistant / pre-apprenticeship courses

Apprenticeships

- ▶ To become an apprentice, a student must seek a position with an employer who has been approved as an apprenticeship employer by SOLAS
- ▶ Employers can be:
 - Sole Trader e.g. self-employed electrician;
 - Large companies e.g. Mercury Engineering, Sisk Group, Jones Engineering
 - Semi-state companies e.g. ESB, Dublin Bus
- ▶ Interested students should research options on www.apprenticeship.ie which provides comprehensive information about all 60+ types of apprenticeships and provides details of employers seeking apprenticeships
- ▶ Students should also consider pre-apprenticeship courses in a PLC college e.g. Plunket College offers courses in carpentry and motor mechanics
- ▶ We have asked any student to email us their name and preferred area for an apprenticeship in order to have a database for employers who contact the school
