Dear Parent/Guardian,

The aim of Work and Community Placement (WCP) is to provide students with a deeper understanding of the workplace and practical firsthand experience of the working world. It is a wonderful opportunity to try new areas, develop new skills, challenge perceptions, and make extremely useful contacts for future endeavours.

We require students to seek a position for a full day every Monday during the school term. This year, Monday work placement runs from **26th August- 26th May 2025 inclusive**.

We encourage all students to try different placements on a Monday throughout the year. As a school, we pride ourselves on nurturing global citizenship, and we would encourage all students to complete volunteer work in a charity organisation and/or social enterprise initiatives where possible.

We would like to assure you that all students will be fully covered by the school insurance for all hours of placement. All work experience is on a voluntary basis and should not involve payment.

Students may need to be Garda vetted for positions working with children or vulnerable persons. Please be aware that this process can only start once a student is 16 years old and takes approximately 3 weeks to complete.

It is the responsibility of the student to seek appropriate placement as this is part of the learning process. All parents must be satisfied with the environment in which placement(s) will take place for their son or daughter. The school does not conduct off site inspections on working conditions or personnel, or vet employers.
